Definition of liquids / The following products are regarded as liquids

- creams
- deodorants
- shower gels
- peanut butter
- liquid lipstick, e.g. gloss
- liquid mascara
- white cheese
- gels
- beverages of any kind
- hair gels
- any kind of foam
- yoghurt
- mixtures of liquids and solid matter
- lotions
- oil
- paste
- perfume
- shaving foam
- roll-on deodorants
- chocolate spread
- syrup
- sprays
- spray cans
- soups
- water
- soft and process cheese, e.g. camembert
- toothpaste
- or products of similar consistency

The following products are not regarded as liquids

- peanut butter sandwich
- solid lipsticks
- hard cheese, e.g. edam, parmesan
- powder
- sandwich with chocolate spread
- talcum powder

Exceptions

Medication

Indispensable medication in liquid form is allowed. The amount is equivalent to the requirements during the flight, e.g.

medicine for diabetics. Depending on the situation, a medical certificate in English language may be helpful.

Baby food

If travelling with an infant, baby milk and liquid baby food are allowed.

Liquids from duty free sales at the airport

Different airports and regions have different regulations in place for items purchased from duty free sales. If

purchasing liquids from duty free sales, please inform them of your itinerary so that they can check whether

you will be permitted to carry the items with you.
